

Now, in my church family, I am the oldest (not the wisest!) I would like to share some church history.

Mike and I met in the CofE (Church of England) Youth Club. It was called 17+ but everyone was in their twenties. We had both just completed our training, Mike as a chartered accountant and me as a teacher.

We moved several times after we were married and attended CofE churches but soon became disillusioned - too much ceremony and not enough spiritual content. We transferred to

the URC (United Reformed Church) in Saltdean called St Martins. We were both invited to become elders and we felt at home there. St Martins was one of a group of seven churches overseen by five ministers. We had group elders meetings but discovered that two churches were not represented, one of which was Telscombe Cliffs URC which seemed to be the only church outside the Brighton area and virtually unknown and unrecognised! In fact the plan was to close this 'little church'!

We had got to know some members and wanted to support them so we asked if we could join them and represent them. They graciously accepted this suggestion and we transferred our membership from St Martins in order to given them "a voice".

There were many meetings, including residential weekends, where many suggestions were made to close small churches, some ludicrous like putting a cross on the wall! We pointed out that our walls were white!

Some people had 'given their all' in service to the church and now blood was needed. After some fresh ideas, several things happened. An Alpha course brought in some folk and more people 'stepped up' with suggestions. This was when the old factory was closed and houses were built alongside the church. We made two suggestions to church 'bosses' and to the council and got the new road named as Church Close. We also changed the rather lengthy church name to Telscombe Cliffs

Community Church - we were in business!

By this time four of the five ministers had moved on and only our dear friend Graeme remained. He will be taking wellearned retirement soon and we shall certainly miss his wise and helpful ministry!

I have been delighted to see our dear church flourish and have really enjoyed being part of the team. There was a time when I could ....

#### A word from Neil

#### **REAP WHAT YOU SOW!**

At this time a year Harvest is all around us. We are blest living where we do to be surrounded by the downs and fields that blend into our town. You only need to walk across the Tye and you will see the farmer reaping the harvest planted months before as seed.

As Christians we sow our seeds with the hope that it will reap a rich harvest. But our seeds are not that of plain wheat sowed in the earth. Our seeds are given by God and represent his love. That love on its own is personal to us. But sown throughout the community we live in, nurtured and encouraged, that love becomes a rich harvest and our reward will be realised by God himself. Look after the love that God gives us, promote and nurture that love. Spread it wide and see the harvest you will gain, more and more knowing the love that God has for us and for them also. A harvest worthy for us to work toward no matter how old or young.

May we help, this harvest, to reap the love that he has for all his children.



#### Plum streusel cake from Lin

#### For the topping

- 2oz plain flour
- ½ tsb ground mixed spice (optional)
- 2oz ground almonds
- 2oz butter cut into small cubes
- 3½ oz demerara sugar

#### For the base

- 3½ oz self raising flour
- I tbs baking powder
- 3½ oz ground almonds
- 5oz caster sugar
- 3½ oz butter cut into small cubes

- 2 eggs lightly beaten
- 2 tbsp natural yoghurt
- 6 plums stoned and quartered

#### **Method**

Preheat oven, gas 4/180 or 170 fan oven.

Lightly butter & flour or use baking paper a square or round loose bottom deep cake tin.

#### For the topping

Put into a food processor, or if mixing by hand into a bowl,



2oz plain flour and ½ tsp ground mixed spice (optional).

Cut 2oz butter into small cubes and add 2oz ground almonds. Pulse in mixer or rub together by hand until it resembles breadcrumbs, then mix in 3½oz demerara sugar and set aside.

#### For the base

Put into processor or bowl 3½oz self raising flour, I tsb baking powder, 3½oz ground almonds, 5oz caster sugar and 3½oz butter. Pulse or mix by hand until it resembles breadcrumbs.

Add the beaten eggs and yoghurt. Pulse or beat with a spoon until just combined. Pour into tin level top.

Scatter over plums skin side down, so they just sit on top of the mixture. Sprinkle over topping.

Bake for about 1 hr 10-20 mins until the skewer inserted into the cake comes out clean. Serve warm with custard or leave to cool for 10 mins in tin and then turn out to cool completely on a wire rack. In which case dust with icing sugar before serving.

Plums can be replaced with apple, figs or blackberries.

They say it freezes well, but it's never made my freezer yet!!

A family favourite which has been passed down through the generations.

### Sausage and apple cobbler by Jackie

This is our family favourite. Feeds a crowd from one pot so great when washing up and great value too!



- Pack of sausages
- 2 carrots
- 2 sticks of celery
- I leek
- 2 apples
- ½ litre of apple juice
- I onion
- 250ml vegetable stock
- 25g butter
- 100g self raising flour

#### **Method**

Preheat oven, gas 4/180 or 160 fan oven.

Brown the sausages and popinto a casserole dish.

Peel and slice the apples, carrots, onion, celery and leek.

Toss in a little flour and add to the sausages.

Pour over the stock and apple juice.

Back for 45 mins.

Meanwhile make the cobbler by rubbing 25g butter into the 100g self raising flour until it looks like breadcrumbs. Add a little milk to make a dough. Then shape into small balls.

After 45 mins, pop the balls on top of the sausages and bake for another 30mins.

### Our aim:

For Telscombe Cliffs Community Church to be accessible to everyone



TCCC is a great and valued space for everyone but not everyone, every week can get here.

Our goal is to make the access improvements needed at the front of the church (e.g., wheelchair ramps, handrails, ground levelling and a disabled parking space) leading into the church to benefit the congregation and community, such as enabling elderly or disabled individuals to participate fully.

The funding target based on quotes from contractors is £15,000. Through our own efforts we have already raised £5000, so our target through crowd funding is £10,000.

The church serves as a community hub, and its hall hire is available for clubs, exercise classes and celebrations. Our church welcomes everyone, but limited access prevents some from joining us fully.

These changes will ensure all community members can worship and participate in events safely.




